Across Yorkshire, the Grants Committee, led by Peter Johnston, one of our long standing Trustees, has continued to support a diverse range of historic buildings with grants. The Trustees have been able to distribute more than £98,000 to twenty nine churches and chapels across the region. This is a tremendous effort and enhances the fundraising campaigns that many of these churches run, securing support from across the region and further afield.

Events are one of the things that brings the membership together to celebrate the work of the trust. I'm delighted that the Trustee board has been strengthened throughout the year with the recruitment of individuals who have a strong commitment to bringing the Membership together.

I look forward to seeing many of you in the coming year, and thanks for all you do, individually and collectively, to support our work.

Chairman's Report



As I write this the life of the country is on hold whilst it tackles the Coronavirus outbreak. Although this has had no impact on the activities of the Yorkshire Historic Churches Trust during 2019 it has forced the cancellation of events planned for 2020 and reduced the energy and impact that our Friends have on the life of the Trust. That said, at the recent Trustees' meeting we were able to approve over £60,000 of support to Yorkshire's Churches and Chapels and hopefully will be able to continue to do so into the future.

2019 was a year of consolidation rather than change. The trust distributed £98,250 to those churches listed on page 7. It was able to do so only through the work and generosity of the charitable community. By that I mean charitable Trusts and foundations, particularly the Liz and Terry Bramall Foundation, individual donors and legacies, support from the business sector and most vital of all the support given by Friends and their friends to membership and events. For this support the trustees are extremely thankful.

It is disappointing that the Ride and Stride, which is so successful in Oxfordshire and Suffolk seems to struggle in the north of England. Possibly that has something to do with the distance between churches and the hills to bicycle up to get to them. However, the trust will continue to support the Ride and Stride and will welcome new participants. Your trustees are working on ways to raise the profile of Yorkshire's churches and hope to launch a renewed focus next year.

We are also working on ways to assist the basic maintenance work needed on every building every year. Simple tasks like cleaning out gutters are more complicated round the eaves of high roofs and on church towers but they need doing every year. Lack of basic maintenance causes significant deterioration to the fabric of a building often leading to more major work in the future: A stitch in time etc...
